Staff who provide or intend to provide Intensive In-Home Services must have training on the specific service. The NC Council of Community Programs is sponsoring a two-day session that will help meet this requirement.

Who Should Attend?

The training is relevant for front-line staff and agency directors who are interested in a high quality training program that satisfies training requirements for Intensive In-Home Services and teaches the necessary content for actually providing the service. **The first day of the training focuses on the clinical aspects of the service and the second day focuses on the service definition and administrative considerations.**

- How to apply a clinical model for providing Intensive In-home (IIH) Services
- How to organize and structure your time to provide the service
- Suggested tools and techniques for getting started with individuals and their families
- How to interpret and apply the specific service definition in North Carolina
- How to incorporate the proposed changes to the service definition into your work
- Where to go for continuing education and support
